




















Creating Lasting Homeownership

Last year, Home HeadQuarters welcomed **more than 550 prospective homeowners** to its free HomeOwnership Workshop. More than 75% of those participating went on to graduate from our nationally-certified Homebuyer Education Course. We provided Down Payment and Closing Cost Assistance to **111 first-time home buying families** and provided after-purchase counseling to more than 200 people. **More than 1,200 counseling sessions** were provided to families in danger of losing their homes last year helping to prevent imminent foreclosure for almost 95 families.



Opportunity Headquarters

In the past 15 years, Home HeadQuarters has **redeveloped more than 525 properties** in the City of Syracuse. This past year though, the Opportunity Headquarters construction crew brought the organization to a new level through LEED certifications, affordable green construction practices and the use of new materials—all while running a construction apprentice program. In 2011 nearly 50 properties were redeveloped through full vacant rehabilitation, new single-family construction, demolition or collaborative development partnerships.


